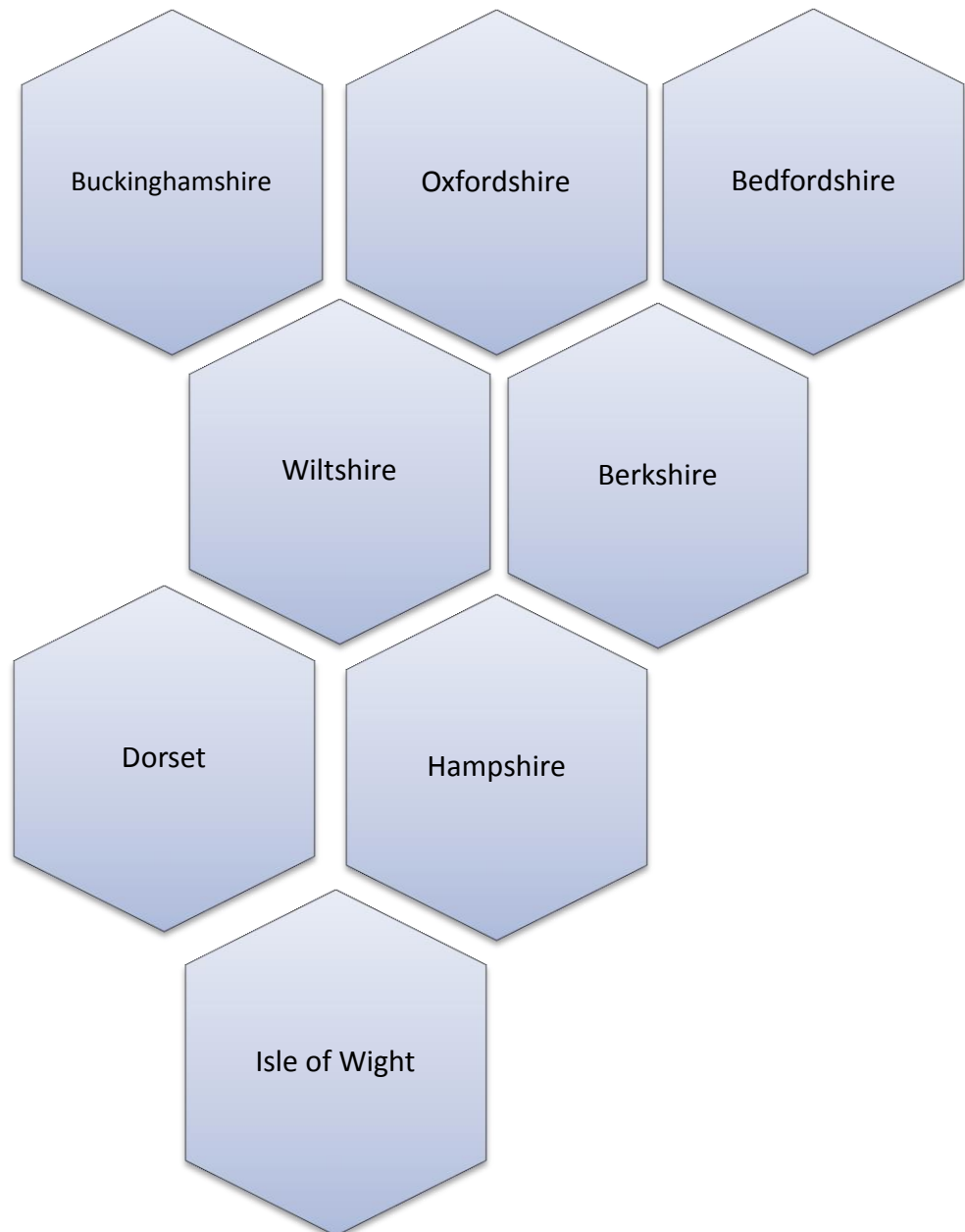


SOUTH CENTRAL CLINICAL AUDIT NETWORK ANNUAL REPORT

The South Central Clinical Audit Network (SCCAN) has sixteen member organisations from:



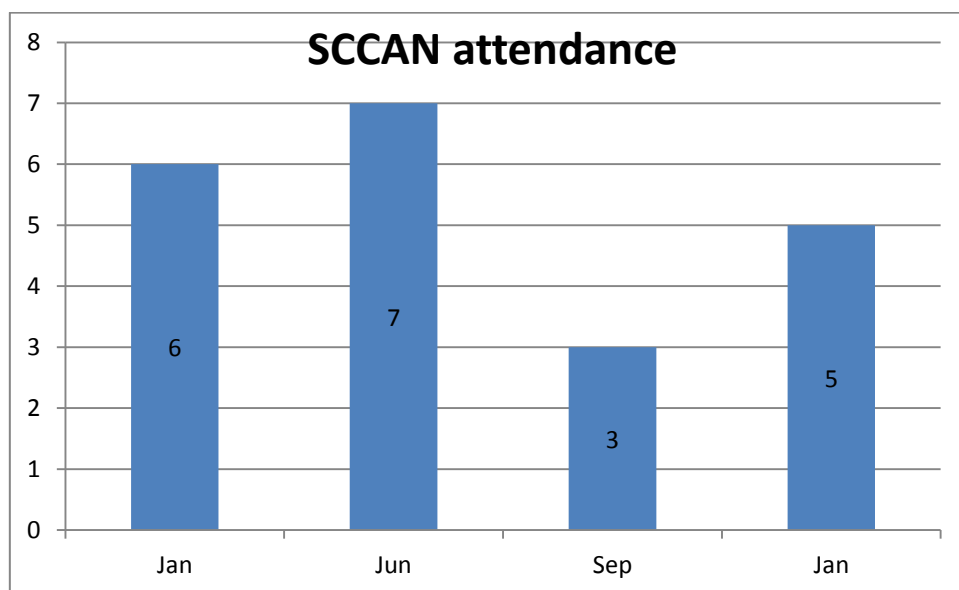
In 2018 – 2019 the SCCAN Terms of Reference were reviewed and it was agreed to move from 3 meetings a year to 4. The meetings are planned to happen within two weeks of N-QI-CAN meetings to facilitate prompt information sharing. In the past year the following meetings were held:

- January 2018 – Royal Bournemouth Hospital
- June 2018 – Dorset Healthcare
- September 2018 – Amersham Hospital
- January 2019 – Basingstoke

Prior to each N-QI-CAN meeting the Chair e-mails group members to ask if there are any issues they feel should be raised at that meeting, or that they would like added to the agenda for the SCCAN meeting. Feedback from the N-QI-CAN meeting is brought to the SCCAN meeting, and discussed.

At each SCCAN meeting there is a presentation from the local NICE Field Team, this includes updates on guidance and resources available, and provides an opportunity to provide feedback to the national team.

Each meeting has time set aside for networking and sharing learning as feedback from members has indicated that this is found valued by members as a useful feature of the meetings.



Challenges

- Attendance is very low at some meetings
- Comparatively small network
- No consistent central location for meetings
- No remote access to meetings available

Successes

- Finding a central venue which is accessible and affordable has reduced travelling time to meetings
- Appointment of a Deputy Chair
- Utilisation of NQICAN Forum
- NICE Field Team updates at each meeting

Plans

- Increase use of technology to allow remote access to meetings
- Include a training element in each meeting - increasing length of meetings to accomodate this
- Link with NQICAN objectives for the coming year
- Succession planning for new Chair
